- 1. Students are asked to decorate paper bags according to the holiday closest to the time they are doing the project (i.e. Christmas, St. Patrick's Day, etc.).
- 2. Each bag is filled with the following food items: 100% juice pack, granola bar, cheese crackers, a box of raisins and/or a fruit cup.
- 3. Each bag is filled with the following paper goods: napkin, plastic spoon (if necessary) and a straw.
- 4. Students can do one of the following: a note/card to say "Hi", a school supply (i.e. pencil, eraser) or a joke/riddle the student made up.

Outreach Bags will be shared with homeless men and women.

- 1. Students fill a small brown lunch bag with the following food items: 100% juice pack, granola bar, cheese crackers, a box of raisins or a fruit cup.
- 2. Each bag is filled with the following paper goods: napkin, plastic spoon and a straw (if necessary).
- 3. Students can add one of the following small sample sized toiletries: a small pack of tissues; small toothpaste and a toothbrush; shampoo; conditioner; hand lotion; lip balm; deodorant; or soap.
